Route: You can travel to the meeting venue by train from Amsterdam Schiphol Airport. Trains leave every ten minutes to Amsterdam. You can get from the central station and take tram number 2 or 12 toward the city centre. When the tram arrives at Keizersgracht stop, gets off and walks for 1 minute.



Here are a couple of tips for your transport within Amsterdam.

- There are several different ways to get around Amsterdam using public transportation.
- No matter where you need to go, you may use a metro, tram, bus, ferry or train to get there!
- The Amsterdam public transport system offers the exact ticket pricing across all its services.
- Buses and trams don't accept cash, so it'll be beneficial to get a ticket.
- The most convenient option for visitors is a disposable one-hour or day card.
- Night buses run from 12:30 a.m. until 7:00 a.m., and you can buy a ticket from the driver.
- When it rains in Amsterdam, the surcharges on Uber can get very expensive.
- Bikes are a very quick and easy way to travel around the city.
- Parking is very expensive in Amsterdam, so renting a car is not the most affordable way to get around unless you have parking at your hotel.
- If you're heading out of the city, a car can make sense, and you can hire a vehicle at Schipol airport or from Sixt or Enterprise near Amsterdam's Central Station.

Ticket options

- 1- Single-use train ticket from the airport to the centre: 6.60€ Can be purchased from kiosks
- 2- Single-use city ticket (metro/tram/bus): 3.20€ Can be purchased from kiosks
- 3- 90 minutes intercity ticket (metro/tram/bus): 6.50€ Can be purchased from kiosks
- 4- 1/2/3/4 day unlimited city ticket (metro/tram/bus): 9€ / 15€ / 21€ / 26.5€ Can be purchased at the kiosk or online (https://bit.ly/3j2OPC5).
- 5- The Amsterdam Travel ticket is a smart paper card. With this ticket, you will check in at the beginning and check out at the end of every trip. versions of the Amsterdam Travel Ticket are available: 1, 2 or 3-day. The price for the 1-day (\in 18), 2-day (\in 24) and 3-day (\in 30) tickets are available.

Using your public transport chip card

The most important tip for using your public transport chip card is always to remember to check in and check out! At the start of your journey, hold your card up to the card reader until you see a green light and hear a beep. Do the same every time you leave the tram/bus/metro (also required if changing to another bus or tram). In buses and trams, card readers are located inside the vehicle next to each door. If travelling by metro or train, you need to check in and check out at the card readers located on free-standing poles near the entrance/exit of each station.

On all forms of transport, look for the OV-Chipkaart logo (pictured above right). If you forget to check out, your card may no longer be valid for the next part of your journey, and if you forget to check in, you risk being fined by the transport operator.

Please note: if travelling on local public transport with a rechargeable card, the card must contain enough credit to complete a single journey.

ACCOMODATION OF COMMODIA

Please find some hotel/hostel alternatives close to the meeting venue.

Amsterdam Backstage Hotel

The Backstage Hotel Amsterdam is located close to the Leidseplein on the Leidsegracht (canal), around the corner of the main nightlife scene. Most well-known venues and bars are within walking distance. Venues such as Paradiso and Melkweg are located within 5 minutes and 1 minute walking distance. Other known venues in the area are The Cave, Bourbon Street, Sugar Factory and "home of the blues" Maloe Melo. The major Amsterdam museums (Rijksmuseum, Van Gogh and the Stedelijk Museum of Modern Art are around the corner from Museum Square. The Anne Frank House (10 minutes), the Canal District (the BackStage is right in it). The best bars and restaurants and most shopping areas are all very close.

Hotel Plantage

Hotel Plantage is located opposite the Artis Zoo and offers free Wi-Fi. Each room has double glazing and light-proof curtains for a peaceful sleep. The guest rooms have box-spring beds, a private bathroom, and a TV. Hotel Plantage does not serve breakfast, but there are many restaurants and cafés in the surrounding area. Fresh coffee and cold soft drinks are available 24 hours daily in the lobby.

Hotel Park Plantage

Hotel Park Plantage is a 3-star hotel in the greenest area of central Amsterdam. Rembrandtplein and the Artis Zoo are within walking distance, as is the University of Amsterdam. The Artis tram stop offers quick access to Amsterdam Central Station with tram 14. The rooms have air conditioning and an en suite bathroom. Furthermore, the hotel offers free Wi-Fi, a lift and a telephone/fax service.

The Lancaster Hotel Amsterdam is located in a charming Amsterdam townhouse in the greenest part of the city centre and opposite Artis Zoo. All compact rooms are decorated with warm colours and come with a TV, free WiFi, tea and coffee-making facilities and a compact bathroom.

Hotel Arena

Hotel Arena is located in the upcoming eastern part of Amsterdam. Guests can enjoy food and drinks with a view at the café- restaurant PARK. Furthermore, Hotel Arena offers a terrace; rooms at Hotel Arena come with high ceilings, large windows, sloping walls, wooden beams and original ornaments. All rooms are different, but each has a flat-screen TV, air conditioning, a seating area and a private bathroom. The hotel offers 24-hour reception, free WiFi, bicycle rental and a host who can share various local tips during your stay.
